SRPF commandant among 11 in hospital

IPS officer Nisar Tamboli, currently posted as Commandant of SRPF, was hospitalised after he collapsed while running the Mumbai Marathon on Sunday, police said. The 47-year-old officer collapsed while running and had to be rushed to the Jaslok hospital. Doctors, after ruling out a heart attack, later said it was a case of dehydration.

As many as 2,500 people required medical attention during the course of the run, including 11 who had to be hospitalised. "They are most likely to be discharged this evening as they had no cardiac problems. No severe cases were reported," said Dr Vijay D'Silva, Medical Director of Asian Heart Institute, which had set up medical aid stations along the route.
